## RE: AB 1657 (Wicks) Affordable Housing Bond of 2024 - SUPPORT

Dear Assemblymember Wicks:

On behalf of a united coalition of California's leading affordable housing, homelessness, and housing justice organizations we write in support of Assembly Bill 1657, your bill to authorize critically needed funds through a statewide housing bond to support existing critical and successful affordable housing programs in California.

Currently, California has a gap of 1.2 million homes affordable to lower-income households and on any given night, roughly 160,000 people in California experience homelessness. Historically, the state has used voter-approved General Obligation bonds to fund the construction and rehabilitation of affordable housing and support homeownership. The Veterans and Affordable Housing Bond Act of 2018 authorized \$3 billion funding for various affordable housing programs. These funds will be fully allocated by the end of 2024. While the state has taken significant steps in recent years to address the housing and homelessness crises, we must invest at a higher scale in deeply affordable housing development, preservation, and homelessness.

AB 1657 comes at a crucial time for California. The state has received more than \$3.5 billion in funding requests from affordable housing developers – an oversubscription rate of more than 4:1. With addition investments in successful housing programs such as the Multi-Family Housing Program (MHP) and the Low-Income Housing Tax Credit Program (LIHTC), the state could get over 15,000 permitted, shovel-ready affordable housing projects to construction and assist in the development of thousands of affordable homes currently in the development pipeline.

We support the proposed programs included in the bond through AB 1657, which, together we believe will invest in our essential strategies for the production and preservation of affordable housing:

- Multifamily Housing Program (MHP), including funding for capitalized operating subsidy reserves for supportive housing units;
- Portfolio Reinvestment Program;
- Energy Efficiency Low-Income Weatherization Program;
- A program to fund the acquisition and rehabilitation of unrestricted housing units and attach long-term affordability restrictions on the housing units, while safeguarding against the displacement of current residents;

- CalHome and home purchase assistance programs;
- Joe Serna, Jr. Farmworker Housing Grant Program; and
- A program to finance housing and housing-related activities that will enable tribes to rebuild and reconstitute their communities.

Thank you for your leadership on this critical issue to address homelessness and our affordable housing shortage by providing a statewide housing fund.
